A BIG THANK YOU ALL

Thank you to all of you who "relieved the distressed" in any way in the aftermath of the hurricanes, whether it be as an individual donating time and or money through nationally recognized relief organizations or through our Lodges.

The following communications received from Michael W. Dutton, Sovereign Grand Master, and Terry Barrett, Sovereign Grand Secretary, on September 2, 2005. The Grand Lodge of Washington started a Hurricane Katrina motivated Hunger and Disaster Fund relief effort.

You answered the call with (26) Odd Fellow Lodges, (3) Rebekah Lodges, (1) Encampment, (1) Ladies Encampment Auxiliary and (3) individuals donating \$8,063, of which the donors requested that \$2,015 be directed to Louisiana and \$1,975 be directed to Mississippi. The Grand Lodge of Washington added \$1,000 and on December 15, 2005, a total of \$9,063 was sent to The Sovereign Grand Lodge "Hunger and Disaster Fund" with a report of the donors and their requested distribution.

THE SGL "EVERY MEMBER CAMPAIGN"

By supporting the IOOF/SOS Children's Village in Battambang Cambodia, we now have an opportunity to serve two of our tenets, "relieve the distressed" and "educate the orphan." In the November 14, 2005 letter sent to all Odd Fellow Lodges, a figure of \$371.66 per Lodge to finish this project appeared. This office will be pleased to receive and track donations in any amount from Lodges until March 15, 2006, at which time a report of the collected funds will be sent to SGL. 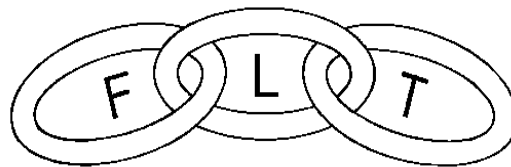
THE NEW YEAR IS A TIME FOR CHANGE

Dear Ladies,

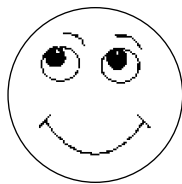

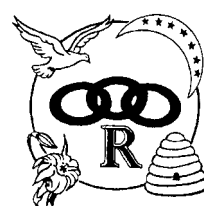

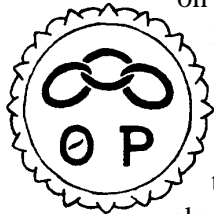

HAPPY NEW YEAR MATRIARCHS AND PATRIARCHS

Dear Matriarchs and Patriarchs,

It's that time of the year when the weather gets cold and Jack Frost is nipping at our noses. I hope you have a warm spot to stay cozy.



I will report on the S.O.S. Children's Village and answer your questions.

I've been asked, what does S.O.S. mean? It is calling people to help children.

Why was Cambodia chosen for our home? First, the need is so great. Battambang is the second largest city in Cambodia. It has a population assumed to be 95,000. An estimated 54 percent of Cambodians live on less than \$1 per day. Children under the age of 18 make up more than half of the Cambodia's inhabitants. Of these children, almost half are malnourished. One in eight dies before their fifth birthday and AIDS is a constant threat to young lives. Cambodia has one of the highest AIDS rates in Asia. In 2000, some 4,500 children under the age of 15 died and 30,000 children are orphans. I believe there is a strong need to help this country. If we all pull together, we can be of service to them.

How many children and workers live in our home? There are 150 children, 16 mothers, four aunts, one Village Director, seven co-workers, nine junior co-workers, and five teachers.

Next month I will tell you how we can help the children.

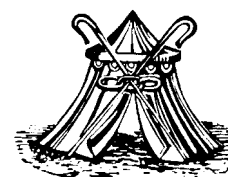
Greetings,
