Past Grand Matriarch Dorothy Boede passed away in January, 2007. She was initiated into H.P. Downs L.E.A. #61 on October 6, 1978, became an associate member of Snohomish L.E.A. #25 on November 12, 1990, then transferred her membership into Snohomish Unified Encampment #25 in June, 2006.

Dorothy was the Grand Matriarch of the Grand Ladies Encampment Auxiliary in 1996-97 and served with her counterpart Antonio Tamburello as the Grand Patriarch.

For her program, she selected as her emblem the Eagle. The American Eagle is the symbol of things Americans hold dear — freedom, leadership and the power to endure.

Her colors were blue, white and silver. Her flower was the white rose and her motto was, "Peace plus progress through cooperation. Dorothy's songs were "Alice Blue Gown," and "It Is No Secret." Her fun song was "Side By Side." She chose as her scripture Psalms 118:24 — "This is the day the Lord has made. We will rejoice and be glad in it."

Her aim was to help the Encampment as well as the L.E.A. and to do our best to obtain new members. The project was the Sheppard/VanderLinden fund — visual aid for adults.

Dorothy presided over the 1997 Session of the Grand Ladies Encampment Auxiliary on June 20-21 in Richland.

She is survived by her husband, Henry Boede, her children and grandchildren.

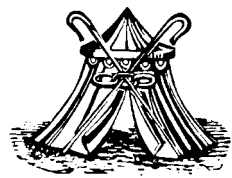

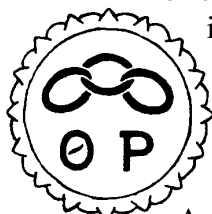

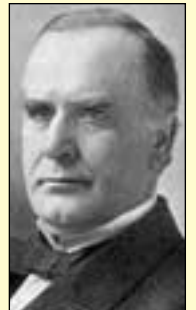
