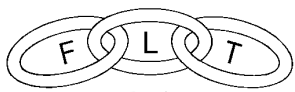

During the last several years, the "growth" or interest earned on the Home's Endowment Fund has allowed us to pursue several projects to improve the quality of resident life. A list of these projects appears below:

- A wheelchair van for transporting residents to medical appointments, shopping and cultural events.
- A blood pressure monitor that allows residents and staff to check their blood pressure on a daily basis.
- A Sony camcorder for videotaping programs (Christmas, 90+ birthday parties, etc.) to play in the Care Centers for residents who are unable to attend the "live" programs.
- Putting green and Bocce' Ball court for resident enjoyment.
- An outdoor fountain at the Clinton and Merriam Street Apartments.
- A wall fountain in the main lobby of the Administration Building.
- West Care Center lobby remodel (in progress).
- Cooking center — stove, dishwasher, sink, cabinets, etc. (located in the Activity Room and not completed at this time).
- Funds set aside to purchase a "big" bus in 2008.

PGM Ira Lee Brown passes in Vancouver

Ira Lee Brown, Past Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington, passed away July 12 in Vancouver, WA at the age of 94. Brother Ira was born on February 8, 1913 in North Fork, West Virginia.

Brother Ira served as Noble Grand of Vancouver Lodge #3 from January 1, 1955 through June 30, 1955 where he obtained the honors of a Past Grand.

Ira served as Grand Master during year 1977 - 1978 and presided at the 1978 session of the Grand Lodge of Washington held in Richland, WA.

He retired as a conductor from Burlington Northern Railroad in 1977 after 35 years of service. He also was a WW II Veteran serving in the Seabees in the Philippine Islands for two years.

Brother Ira wore many different hats in the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. As Noble Grand of Vancouver IOOF Lodge #2, in 1955 he dedicated a drinking fountain to the City of Vancouver. Today, that fountain still stands in Leverich Park adorned with a bronze commemorative plaque.

In addition to serving as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Washington, Brother Ira was a Past Chief Patriarch of Hebron Encampment #17 and a Major in Canton #17. He participated in many different Odd Fellow functions during his lifetime.

Brother Ira said the key to living a long life is "never to worry about anything."

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, July 18, 2007 at Evergreen Staples Funeral Chapel. Burial followed in Bethel Evangelical Methodist Cemetery in Ridgefield.

Brothers and Sisters, thank you for the confidence and trust you have placed in me. It is both an honor and great responsibility to serve you as Grand Master.

September seems like a peculiar month for new beginnings, but as it is my first chance to address all of my Brothers and Sisters as your Grand Master this is where we start.

Some of you have asked me what my project will be, while money collected from the sale of my pins will further support Fisher House, I will not be collecting dollars, but actions. I ask all of our Lodges to choose a project that benefits their local community (most already have), and then host a public event that allows others with similar interests to join you in support of your goal. Make your Lodge a hub of community service opportunities. We are fortunate to belong to an organization that fills a special niche in the fabric of community support. We have ties to no particular religious denominations, are apolitical and seek only to modestly serve through the practical application of Friendship, Love and Truth. Our communities are filled with unclaimed members, individuals whose ideals and values match our own, who are Odd Fellows and Rebekahs in spirit, but not yet name. They need to know that they can join us as we strive "to improve and elevate the character of mankind." Brothers and Sisters, have your guests sign a register so that you can identify these diamonds in the rough.

We are at a critical point in our jurisdiction. Last year we lost several hundred members and several Lodges. We have a very special organization that has done a tremendous amount of good in the past and the potential to do the same in the future, but we are in danger of letting it slip away. We are suffering from disunity and poor morale and appear to have lost our focus. If we continue to conduct ourselves in this way we will continue to get the same result. Our jurisdiction can grow if we choose that as our course. We have strong roots in our communities, a compelling goal and many dedicated individuals. We can grow if we tend our roots, share our goals and foster the strengths of our Brothers and Sisters. Too often we fail to treat one another with friendship and love and we disregard our Rituals and our Laws. While we are reaching out into our communities we must also work to strengthen the communities within our organization. Understanding that while we may not always agree we must trust and respect one another.

Some years ago my father shared with me this test of things we say and do. This is not an Odd Fellow maxim, but very well could be.

- 1. Is it the truth?
- 2. Is it fair to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build good will and better friendships?
- 4. Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

If you can't answer yes to all four of these questions, please don't say it or do it.

We must work together as Brothers and Sisters, as Patriarchs and Matriarchs and as Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, and Theta Rho Sisters. I urge you to choose growth and a return to the principles that made our Order great.

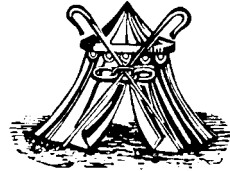
From your 2007-08 Grand Patriarch

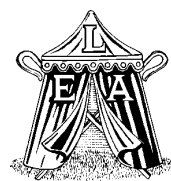
I will close this article with a prayer that I will find you all are in good health and spirits.

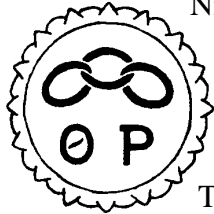

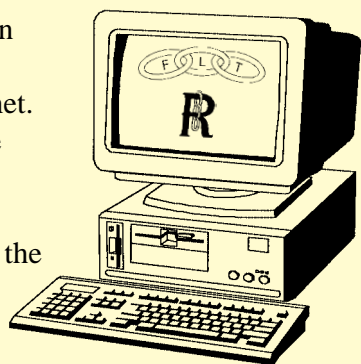
