## Port Townsend Odd Fellows pass out dictionaries, glasses

(The following was written by Erik Hidle and appeared in the Peninsula Daily News on October 28.)

**CHIMACUM** — New dictionaries and new eyeglasses to read them with — those are the first two steps the Independent Order of Odd Fellows are taking in providing south East Jefferson County students with tools to be successful in their education.

“It’s all tied into reading,” said Carson Inman, secretary of the Odd Fellows Mount Baker Lodge #9 in Port Townsend.

“If you have the dictionary at a young age, you start learning how to use it. And if you need glasses and don’t have them, obviously you can’t read very well, so we provide them,” said Inman.

Rotarians have run similar programs for the Port Townsend School District for years, Inman said, but in 2006 he noticed a need in the public school districts in the southern part of the county. For the past four years, Inman and the Odd Fellows have been providing the Chimacum, Quilcene and Brinnon school districts with both dictionaries and eyeglasses as a way of promoting literacy in the districts.

“We believe these two things are the most important starting points as far as education goes,” Inman said. “The dictionaries we give out to students every year in their third grade class. “And the glasses, well, that is all paid for by our members, too. If a student of any age needs glasses or breaks their glasses and can’t afford them, we want to make sure they have access to a pair immediately. We pay for them on the spot.”

Inman said this year the Odd Fellows will hand out more than 90 pocket dictionaries to third grade students.

### TEACHER GRATEFUL

Mary Foster, a third grade teacher at Chimacum Elementary School, said she is grateful for the dictionaries. “It really is a great program,” she said. “I know kids who have gotten them in years past who still hold on to them and use them. We practice how to use them and I think they do become important to the students.”

Inman said he was unsure of how many eyeglasses would be provided to students this year since the group fills the requests as they come in. “None have come across yet this year,” he said. “Last year it was just one, and I think the year before we paid for three different pairs of glasses for students.”

Inman also said he hoped to meet with the school’s superintendents to see what more his group could do. “We always get thank you letters from the kids, and they seem to really be happy to get them,” Inman said. “So we keep coming back and if there is more we can do, we will.”

Kayla Kirk, Director of Activities, said, “It’s been more fun than we anticipated. A lot of our residents are not capable of cooking, but they still enjoy a homey atmosphere.” Residents enjoy sitting around engaging the cooks and savoring a tasty tidbit of food when it comes out of the oven.

Heather Warner, Activities Assistant, observed that the new kitchen is also proving to be therapeutic for residents who are having a difficult time adjusting to daily life in a retirement community. She noted that one woman appeared lost and on the verge of tears. Warner suggested that the woman try spending time in the new cook center. Within a short time, the woman was laughing and talking with other women in the kitchen. “We got her making cookies and her whole personality changed,” Warner said.

The Washington Odd Fellows Home Endowment Fund paid for the kitchen project. Contributions from numerous sources over the last ten years has allowed the Endowment Fund to grow and contribute more than \$219,000 in projects that directly improve the quality of life for the residents of the Home. ### MAKE MEMBERSHIP YOUR TOP PRIORITY!!

January marks the beginning of installations statewide. Congratulations to the newly-elected and appointed officers. It's an exciting time for our order as officers begin their tenure and Noble Grands state their desired goals for their lodge. One goal that we must address with sincerity is the subject of membership. Each lodge should establish a membership committee to support that effort. This is a special committee where the Noble Grand appoints the chairperson and members of this committee. The Membership Committee is charged with coordinating the recruitment effort for the lodge.

In future articles, we'll elaborate on specifics outlined below to help our lodges achieve their goals — and what is that goal? We ask that each member solicit one new member in each branch of our order for the year 2010. It's certainly an attainable and realistic goal. What follows are some tactics, techniques and procedures for the committee to review and build from.

District Deputies will need to brief the Grand Master on membership status and programs in their respective lodges at the next DDGM meeting. Please feel free to contact me with questions you may have as it pertains to increasing membership in our jurisdiction.

### 2010 ODD FELLOW MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

The task of the membership drive is twofold: To increase lodge membership by a certain number and to build a stronger and a more vibrant organization.

Organize a Membership Committee within each lodge that will establish and carry out a strategic plan. Throughout the drive, that committee should meet regularly to assess progress, reallocate resources, revise targets, etc.

**Identify Goals:** *What we want to accomplish.* Find the right balance between realism and ambition. Focus on clearly-identified goals.

**Identify Resources:** *What assets do we have to accomplish the goals?*

- The people
- The issues
- The materials

**Identify Allies:** *Who might help us to achieve the goals?*

Individuals or organizations that have been helpful, but also approach those whose aims dovetail with ours and those we have helped in the past.

**Identify Targets:** *Whom do we recruit to accomplish the goals?*

- Professionals who are non-members
- Recently-lapsed members
- New members
- Particular communities which may be special targets

**Identify Tactics:** *What we have to do to achieve the goals (lodge specific)?*

Outline the specific tasks and methods that make up the drive.

### THE ROLE OF THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The Membership Committee is key to any successful membership drive. It should consist of active members from your lodge, including junior and senior members. The committee should meet and lay out a strategic plan, monitor its implementation, and assess the results. The committee is also responsible for recruiting volunteers from the organization to help carry out the plan. The committee chairperson should be responsible for supervising the activities of the committee.

To carry out the plan, maximize personal contact and minimize the amount of work any one person is asked to do. One-on-one or two-on-one works best when talking to perspective members. Ensure that each member has clear and explicit instructions.

### BASIC TACTICS TO REMEMBER

Keep the lodge's calendar in mind as you plan the drive. Avoid conflicts with particularly busy times and invite prospects to lodge open functions when appropriate




## An update on guidelines for Washington OddFellow reporters

We have printed these guidelines for reporters in *The Washington OddFellow* newspaper several times. As a result, many of your stories are now easier to read and put into type for the newspaper. However, several of you may have overlooked these guidelines. If you can, please keep these guidelines by your typewriter, computer or writing desk for future reference.

Again, here are a few suggestions which will make *The Washington OddFellow* a better newspaper for all of us:

- Be sure to include the name and number of your Lodge and the name of your town if the Lodge name is different. As a reporter, please include your name, too, so we can give you credit.
- If your story is handwritten, leave plenty of space between lines and please print any names so I can get them spelled correctly. Please double check all names. We have spent many hours researching membership rosters to make sure questionable names are spelled correctly and we have corrected the spelling on dozens of names. However, I am sure there are many more misspelled names that have slipped through.
- If your story is typed on paper, please double space and **do not** type your entire story in all capital letters and **do not** use both sides of the paper. Please use **plain white typing paper**, not the onion skin type. If you e-mail your story, **please single space**.
- Please include the names and pertinent information about deceased members on a **separate** piece of paper for the Memoriam column. Information should include the persons name, how long they have been a member and if they were a past presiding officer.
- Remember, *The Washington OddFellow* is received in your home and everyone else's on or about the first of the month. Keep this in mind when you are writing about events that will already have taken place by the time the newspaper is in your mailbox. Even if an event has not yet happened when you write your story, please word your story in the "past tense" if your event takes place before the newspaper comes out.
- Try to keep your stories as concise as possible. You have probably noticed that we have many more Lodges reporting now than we had in the past. Concise stories mean we can fit in news from more Lodges.
- Finally, when you are finished, read over your story to make sure everything is spelled correctly. Then, as a final measure, read the story out loud to yourself or to someone else. This is an easy way to tell if you have left out some important word or fact.
