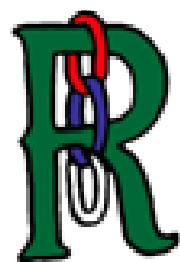

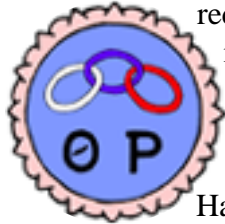

I believe that recorded music has made people feel self conscious and forget the value of personal music making. We judge our performances against recording stars, such as Justin Bieber and Taylor Swift, often finding our musical selves unfit. What is important is that we express our souls and join together in a community activity. Sounding "good" is not the purpose of group singing, it is to join together as one. Song is an integral part of our ritual and ceremonies, and it centers us personally and connects us spiritually. As I travel throughout our Order, I often encounter lodges reciting the odes or skipping them entirely. I believe this is due to the fear of sounding bad. What is important is that we express our souls and join together raising a joyful noise, not to produce a polished piece of art. To quote Saint Cecilia, "When you sing a prayer, God hears it twice."

As the holiday season approaches, let us pause and reflect how blessed we are. Even with the troubles in our lives and the world, we have been given the gift of life and love. Personally, I think the only proper prayer to God is to give thanks for the blessings that have been showered upon us. Other prayers just seem to be greedily asking for more. That the time with a loved one, the years of good health we have enjoyed, ect., are not enough. We want more. Okay, maybe the Jesuits got to me when I was young, but the truth is: life is transitory. Although I wish I had had my departed friends and family with me longer, I'm thankful that I had them in my life for the time that I did. The people and pleasures that we enjoy today will fade like the rose. Take the time to enjoy each other over the holidays, and forget the silly squabbles that separate family and friends. Don't dwell on the troubles and trails of this life, celebrate the goodness in each other. Enjoy and share what we momentarily have. Thanks.
