Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Here it is December already. Half of my year as Grand Master has gone by. I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a joyous and peaceful Christmas and a happy New Year.

I will be making out my visitation schedule after the first of the year. You will be notified in advance of my proposed visitation.

### INCORPORATION

Upon my review of the Washington State Corporation register, I have found that there are a few lodges — Odd Fellow, Rebekah, Encampment, LEA, Canton, LAPM and Theta Rho Clubs — that are not incorporated. For those having Temple or Building Associations, they are to be incorporated separately from the lodge incorporations.

Therefore if your lodge is using that incorporation, you need to apply for a separate lodge incorporation, per Chapter 3, Sec. 3.25 & 3.29 of the Washington Digest. I also found that some that have not filed an Annual Renewal have been classified as inactive due to failure to renew. For those lodges that have not renewed their incorporation, you may have to reapply for incorporation.

The Grand Secretary will be mailing out notices to all Odd Fellow Lodges showing your renewal due date. There will also be instruction on how you can renew on line at the Secretary of State's web site. There will be instructions for applying for incorporation through that web site. Please refer to your respective Constitutions for the Revisionary Rights, which are required on the incorporation documents.

The Grand Lodge is ultimately responsible for insuring that all units of this jurisdiction are incorporated and make Form 990 Annual reports to the IRS. Please, send a copy of your incorporation to the Grand Secretary, along with copies your Incorporation renewals and the unit's most recent IRS Form 990 filing when completed on all lodges and Temple/Building Associations.

## PP Jean Miller dies at 97

Jean B. Miller, 97, Past President of the Rebekah Assembly of Washington, died on November 16 in Belmont. She was elected President in 1968 and presided over the Rebekah Assembly Sessions in 1969. She first joined Leah Rebekah Lodge #22 in Goldendale and later became a member of Isabella Rebekah Lodge #23 in Yakima. She felt that serving as Rebekah Assembly President was one of the many highlights of her life.

Jean was born August 4, 1913 in Maryhill, Washington, the oldest daughter of Arnold Blades and Martha May Hartley Blades. At age of 4 she and her family moved near Hillsboro, Oregon where her father started a sawmill operation. When her father died during the flu epidemic of 1919-20 leaving a widow and two daughters (Jean and Hazel), her mother started back to teaching school in and around Hillsboro. Jean attended Hillsboro school until she graduated in 1930. She attended Washington State College for one semester before moving back to Maryhill with her grandfather.

She married Claude Miller on July 5, 1933 and they lived in and around Maryhill until 1942 when they moved near Goldendale where they farmed. In 1971 they moved to Moxee. Her husband passed away in 1980 and in 2004 she moved in with her oldest son and daughter-in-law (Bob and Gracie) in Belmont where she lived until her death on November 16 at the age of 97 years.

She was preceded in death by her parents, an infant daughter (Elizabeth Jean), Her husband (Claude), and her sister (Hazel).

Survivors include two sons, Robert A. (Grace) of Belmont and Donald P. (Roberta) of Bonney Lake. Also surviving are five grandchildren and four step grandchildren, ten great grandchildren and four step great grandchildren and also five great-great grandchildren.

During her life she worked as a bookkeeper for automobile agencies in Goldendale and Yakima. She enjoyed watching and following world events, she enjoyed many different crafts and most of all she was interested in and enjoyed her many grandchildren.
