

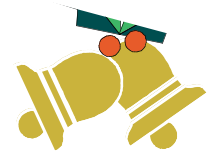

Buckley Encampment #40 re-chartered Oct. 8

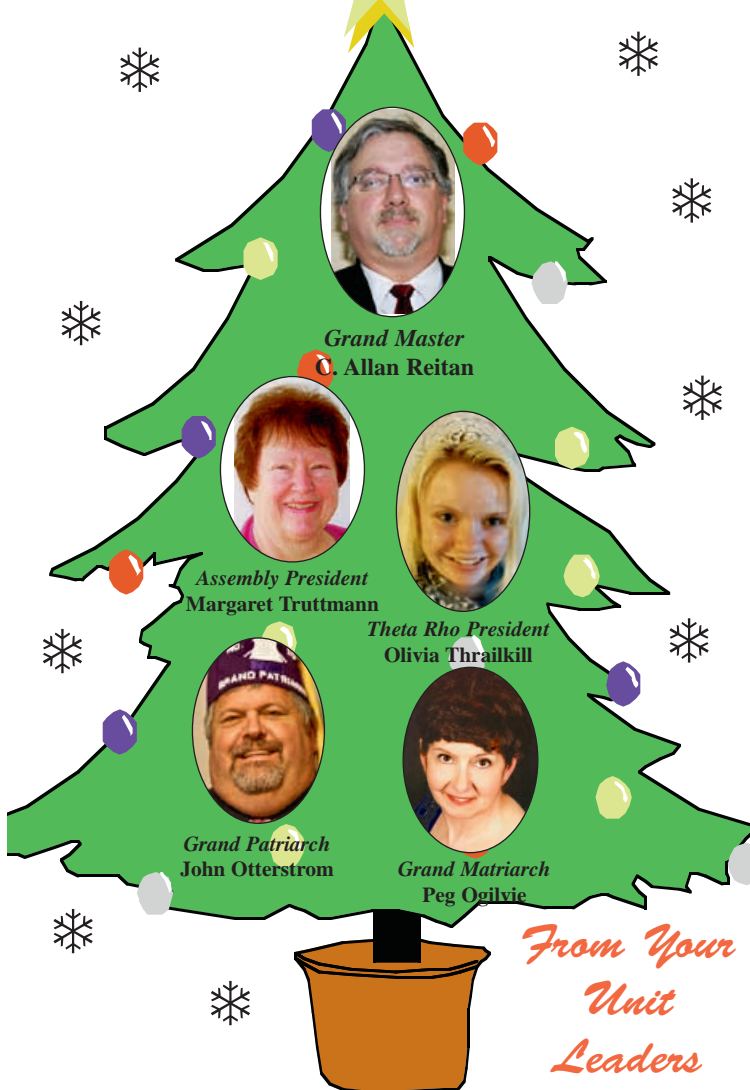

THE GRAND MASTER'S EMBLEM THE WRIGHT FLYER

The Wright Flyer was chosen as the emblem this year for a couple of reasons. Foremost the Brothers and Sisters who have gotten to know me over the years know that I enjoy flying small aircraft. In my career I had the unique opportunity to achieve a life goal while my employer supported this effort. I begin simply as a student pilot, and after three years, much studying, and serious practice, I not only complete the fundamental certification to fly an airplane, but also obtained an instrument rating and ultimately a commercial certificate. I had not intended on obtaining the commercial certificate when I first started, but the momentum and enthusiasm that I experienced in working toward a goal propelled me farther than I originally intended.

I was looking back through my logbook as I was preparing this article, and it brings back a few memories of the accomplishment, most notably that I obtained my private pilot's certificate on December 17, 2003 — exactly 100 years to the day after the Wright Flyer's first flight in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina.

Orville and Wilber Wright were established mechanical engineers who ran a bicycle shop in Dayton, Ohio. But they also had a dream and a goal themselves. They were "aero plane enthusiasts" and they studied, read articles, and talked to others who were equally as interested in flying. When they first started the project of creating the first self-propelled, heavier-than-air vehicle, they did not know all of the steps it would take. They had to design their own wind tunnel, and test parts before they were even constructing the first vehicle. In the end, both brothers shared in the jubilation and excitement of their accomplishment. Every

pilot today can still think back to the days when they were first getting started on the path they have taken, and we look with fondness at the humble beginnings that our efforts have come from.

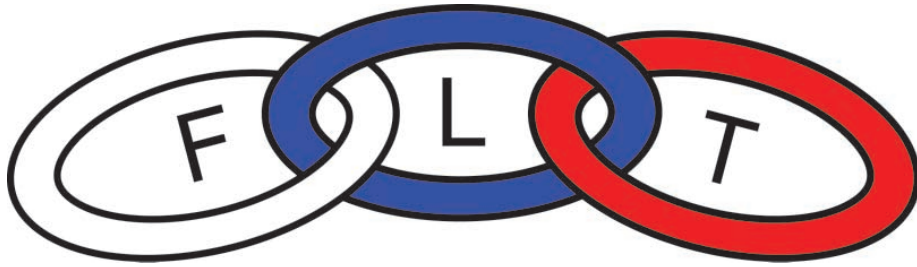

We are planning a Christmas dinner for our first meeting in December with a gift exchange.

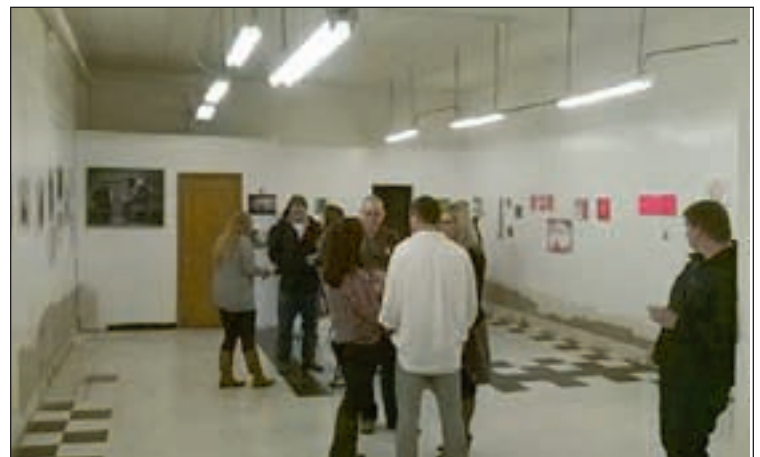
