Grand Re-opening

Ellensburg IOOF Lodge is the toast of the town!!

More than 200 friends, family and community members turned out on November 2 to help Ellensburg IOOF Lodge #20 toast its newly renovated downtown space, which features a new 21-person elevator, an ADA-compliant bathroom, revamped stairs and fresh paint.

Brother Tom Duke, who wrote a \$262,000 state-funded grant for the renovation, and Building Committee Chair Russ Humphrey, who oversaw the installation, used giant scissors to cut a ribbon to the elevator, then guests gathered in the ballroom to watch video testimonials from lodge members and to hear a short welcome and thank you speech by Noble Grand Dave Soltz.

Soltz gave a nod to the many Lodge members who were involved in and donated to the multi-year project, primarily former Noble Grand Jim Schwing, who died at the end of 2022. Soltz gave special

Do you know the right questions to ask for a candidate for membership?


The consensus from interviewing committees is that we don't know what to ask a candidate coming for an interview. I thought about this a while and I have come up with the following. Use it or not, adjust it or not (Odd Fellows or Rebekah), but I think this will give you a good idea. Remember you are interviewing the candidate.

You need to find out pertinent information. And if

the sponsor has done their work that the candidate should know about your lodge. I would really emphasize what day your lodge meetings are, time, and place. Can they make the meetings? If not, why are they joining? It makes no sense for someone to put in an application to a lodge that they cannot attend the meetings.


where in 2020, but we are moving forward.

As you can appreciate, old records are hard to find to verify past memberships.


Yakima Brothers bring some comfort to a Rebekah Sister!

notice to State Legislative Representative Alex Ybarra, who ushered the Local & Community Projects Grant proposal through the 2019 legislative session. Soltz also thanked the primary contractors – Belsaas & Smith Construction Inc., Catlin Electric Inc., Otis Elevator Co. and Moon Security Services Inc. – as well as the Grand Lodge of Washington, which issued an \$85,000 loan that enabled the \$475,000 project to be finished.



"With all of the ADA improvements the lodge is much more accessible to all. The National Association of Students with a Purpose (SWAP), CWU Chapter right here in Ellensburg, has adopted the lodge as a service project this year and provided several volunteers for the party, who refilled snack trays, checked-in guests and poured drinks. Seasoned event organizers Jamie and Meghan Rothwell, representing Support with a Purpose, steered the event planning and provided support for everything from revamping the Lodge #20 website to videotaping lodge-member testimonials. (Jamie and her daughter, Meghan, and son, Dylan, have since decided to join the lodge.) The Grand Lodge of Washington provided the bulk of the funding for the event, with additional funding being provided by the lodge and member donations.



Mt. Constitution IOOF Lodge #88 continues to thrive, building a strong connection among members and the community.




We voted to give \$100 to the Building Manager for Christmas.
